SASKATOON FOOD BANK AND LEARNING CENTRE:

- Adapted how nutrition programs are offered in order to connect with 48 isolated community members through virtual visits and responding to their emergency food needs with contactless drop offs.
- Provided 192.25 hours of learning and work experience to Gardening 101 participants, resulting in 40 bags of produce already delivered to the SFBLC emergency food hampers.
- Distributed 440,000 lbs of food.
- Assembled 1,000 emergency hampers for agencies in support of their clients for delivery, that's only one component of the SFBLC emergency hamper program.
- **Hired, temporarily, 5 former participants** from our Workplace Education program, for work that will give them at least 6 months more paid employment experience.
- Distributed 6,883 pounds of essential items from our Clothing Depot inventory to community members in Client Services.

REGINA FOOD BANK:

- Distributed **10,700 food hampers** in April and May.
- Received and managed an average of **141 phone** calls each day.
- Saved self-isolating clients from traveling a total of 66,613 KM through contact-less delivery.

PLUS thousands of contactless drop offs, virtual food drives, benefit concerts, and donations for the 32 food banks across the province from people like you!
