NUTRIEN'S YEAR-END FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN FOR THE FOOD BANKS OF SASKATCHEWAN HIT GOAL

The Food Banks of Saskatchewan (FBSK) are starting 2022 by thanking Nutrien and the many generous donors across the province for the response to its *Feeding Holiday Cheer* campaign. The campaign launched on Giving Tuesday (November 30, 2021) with a lead donation of \$250,000 from Nutrien. FBSK and the 36 individual food banks collectively raised over \$2.5M.

Donations received are distributed to the 36 registered food banks across the province unless a donor has directed their donation to a specific community. It is expected that there will be an increase in people using food banks in the months ahead.

Nutrien has donated over \$8.25M in financial support, plus employee volunteer time, since 2010 to FBSK.
